Northwest College is hosting a half-day Future Summit Thursday, Sept. 10, from 8 a.m. to noon, that will bring the College and community together to begin charting the future of NWC to

Trapper Sports -Rodeo is a Go!

The NJCAA recently announced it will move fall sports to the spring semester. NWC has a plan in place for student athletes to safely train in preparation for their upcoming seasons. Athletes must complete a daily health screening before they can enter the practice facilities, and locker rooms will be restricted to only the athletes, coaches and trainers. They will also be

required to wash their hands before any athletic activity and will be restricted from sharing personal items such as water bottles.

There is one sport, however, that will have official competition this fall: rodeo. Governed by the NIRA, these athletes will be allowed to travel to competitions in their own vehicles. If they travel together, face coverings are required. This also means that the annual Trapper Stampede Rodeo is a go!

Northwest College's home rodeo event, the Trapper Stampede, takes place starting September 11 and 12 at Stampede Park in Cody. Events include bareback bronc riding, saddle bronc riding, bull riding, barrel racing, steer wrestling and team roping. Tickets can be purchased at the gate, which opens at 6 p.m. Go Trappers!
